The School of Global Environmental Sustainability (SoGES) Diana Wall Sustainability Leadership Fellows program prepares future innovators and thought leaders with state-of-the-art science communication and career development training. Over the course of one year, Fellows develop new skills, interact with a wide variety of experts from different disciplines, and learn strategies to build successful careers that incorporate meaningful science communication, engagement, and interdisciplinarity.

The Sustainability Leadership Fellows program helps early career scientists who will be solving the grand challenges of sustainability have greater impact, reach broader audiences, and think more expansively about their work and its role in the world. This program will enhance your career and your ability to effectively communicate, collaborate, and lead.

#### **PROGRAM PROVIDES FELLOWS WITH:**

- Training to effectively communicate science to the public and media
- Techniques to enhance leadership, time management, and other professional skills
- Strategies for academic engagement in public and political discourse
- Skills, approaches, and tactics to translate knowledge to action
- Techniques for collaboration, leading teams, building effective networks, and transdisciplinary synthesis
- Membership in a growing network of motivated early career researchers from across disciplines at CSU

#### **FELLOWSHIP REQUIREMENTS (NO EXCEPTIONS):**

- Applicants must be ADVANCED PhD students or EARLY career postdoctoral fellows at Colorado State University (PhD students should be finished with coursework, postdoctoral fellows should be less than four years past receipt of their PhD)
- Full, in-person attendance at the following events:
  - 2:00 pm - 4:00 pm, September 2, 2026: Fellow orientation and program meeting
  - ALL DAY, 8:00 am - 5:00 pm, September 9 & 10, 2026: Two-day Science Communication Workshop
  - 8:00 am - 12:00 pm, October 8, 2026: Media Interview Workshop
- Attendance at 4 of 5 workshops, held weekdays 10:00 am - 12:00 pm, on the CSU campus, approximately once per month, from September 2026 to May 2027
- Be on campus and available to participate in planned and additional events and activities during the full 2026-27 academic year

Successful applicants will be selected based on the following criteria:

1. Level of interest in communicating science to the public and media
2. Interest in building leadership and professional development skills
3. Relevance of their research to sustainability science
4. Applicability of training to long-term career plans

Favor will be given to applicants conducting innovative and interdisciplinary work and with strong motivation to improve their communication and leadership skills. The School will also select candidates to represent a diversity of colleges and disciplines.
